NEW!! Student Tardiness Policy

Recognizing the life skill learned through prompt, on time attendance at school, Trinity expects all students to arrive at school on time daily. In the event that a student is excessively tardy at the start of the school day, the following quarterly procedures will take place.

First tardy: Reminder (written or verbal) to student by teacher

Second tardy: Letter or e-mail reminder from the school administrator to parents or guardians

Third tardy: Verbal reminder to student

Fourth tardy: One hour of service time by student and at least one parent, or a \$25.00 assessment
